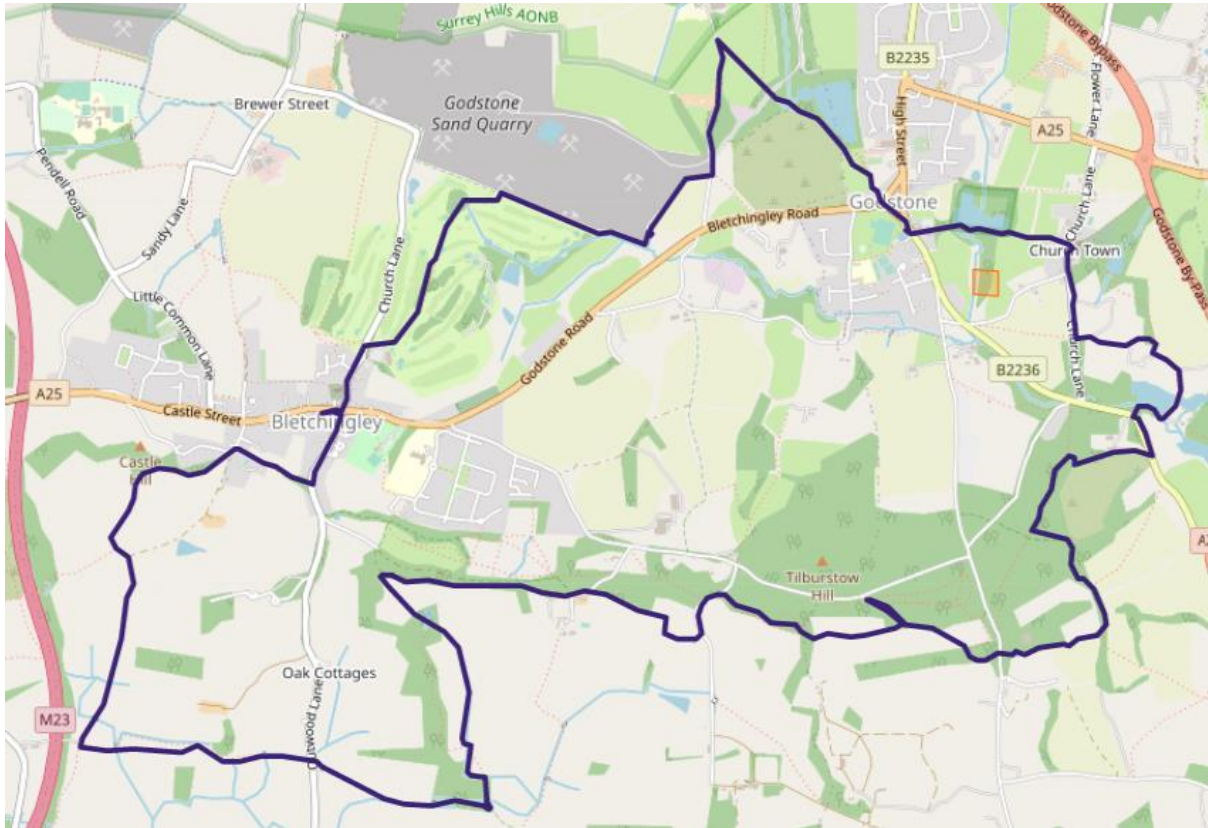


Godstone and Bletchingley (10 miles)



The walk starts high on Tilburstow Hill, situated on the Greensand Ridge to the south east of the village of Godstone in Surrey. The fine wood below the car park gives extensive views of the Weald and is well worth visiting at any time of year for its chestnut trees, wild flowers and fungi. Following the Greensand Way for a good portion of the route, the walk passes through Godstone (where the chapel and almshouses designed by Gilbert Scott are well worth a visit) and Bletchingley (a charming village with an excellent cake shop on the High Street). All in all, the woods, countryside and parklands make this a varied and charming ten mile walk.
